

Instructions to authors

All submitted papers are seen by at least one referee who gives an opinion about acceptability on the basis of originality, scientific reliability of the study, analyses of the data and interpretation of the results. Statistical opinion is sought on most potentially acceptable papers.

Manuscripts and letters will be acknowledged. Those not accepted for publication will be returned if a stamped addressed envelope is enclosed for their return.

Authors should give their names and initials and the posts at the time they did the work. Full address of the corresponding author must be included.

Original papers should not usually be more than 2000 words in length; brief reports should not be more than 1000 words and letters not more than 500 words.

SI units should be used for scientific measurements.

Statistical procedures should be described in the Methods section. References should be provided for the computer software used, if any.

The following are minimum requirements for submission of papers. Detailed instructions can be found in *J. Trop. Ped.* (1980), 26, 1, iii–vi.

- (1) *Typing* should be on one side of paper with double spacing between the lines and margins of at least 5 cm.
- (2) *Submission*: One copy should be submitted, preferably by registered mail, to the nearer of the two editors.

- (3) *References* must be in the Vancouver style as follows:

Journals: Name(s) of author(s): full title of paper: name of journal: year volume no.: first and last page no.

Books and Monographs: Name(s) of author(s), or editor(s) or compiler: title: publisher: year of publication.

Chapter in book: Name of author(s): title of chapter: In . . . Name of Editor(s): title of book, publisher, year of publication: first and last page no. of the chapter.

Number references consecutively in the order in which they are first mentioned in the text.

- (4) *Tables*: Each table should be typed as a separate sheet and numbered consecutively.
- (5) *Illustrations*: All figures should be photographed onto glossy paper. Freehand drawings, x-rays or mimeographed charts are not acceptable. Each figure should have a caption at the back including the Fig. no. written in pencil.
- (6) Authors should give their names and initials and indicate the person responsible for correspondence.

The editors reserve the right to style, and if necessary to shorten material accepted for publication, and to determine the priority and time of publication.
